

Dual Credit

- College credit through Metropolitan Community College
- Dual Credit Requirements:
 - Meet prerequisite for any course
 - Students in the 10th grade must have an overall minimum GPA of a 3.0 (unweighted).
 - Qualifying ACT or Accuplacer
- Students will receive dual credit information from the course teacher.

Advanced Placement (AP)

- Rigorous college-level curriculum
- Widely accepted: Earn potential college credits or advanced placement depending on AP Exam Score
- Scores: 1-5 (need a 3 or higher)
- Earn distinction GPA






Math Flow Chart
